

## Make Your Own Snow Slime!

### **SUPPLIES**

- \* Elmer's white liquid school glue
- \* Liquid starch
- \* Artificial craft snow
- \* Gallon Ziploc bag

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- \* Mix together ½ cup glue and ¼ cup artificial craft snow.
- \*\* Stir in ½ cup liquid starch and then mix with your hands. The mixture should form into a slime consistency pretty quickly. If the slime sticks to your hands, add a little more liquid starch. If it's too stringy and won't stick together, mix in a little more glue.
- \* Want more snow? Go ahead and mix it in!
- \* Store slime in a sealed Ziploc bag.
